


Sri Lanka

- Total Land area 65,525 sq km
- Population 21.32 M (2019)
- Life expectancy (Yrs) 72.4 (Male), 79.6 (Female)
- GDP Per Capita 4,065.22 USD (2017) World Bank
- Unemployment 4.9% (2019 census)
- Older people 7.9 (2012 census), 22% (by 2030)
- Youth Unemployment 20.0% (2019 census)
- Urban population 18.2%





• Economy – Agriculture (12.8%), Industry (29.2%), Services (58.0%)







Sarvodaya Shramadana Movement

- Sarvodaya = Sarva (All)+Udaya (Awakening)
- Founded through *Shramadana* (Gift of time, thoughts, labor and energy) in one rural village in 1958, and ultimately expanded to 15,000 villages through out Sri Lanka
- Presently the Sri Lanka's most broadly embedded community-based development organization network
- Working with 5,200 *legally independent* village societies in all districts including war-torn northern and eastern provinces

Sarvodaya has a vision of a new social order in a society with no poverty and no affluence













Sarvodaya village development

Unit / Organization	Role
Sarvodaya Shramadana Movement	Enrich national policy; mobilize masses and CBOs for peace; Peace meditations and peace marches
SEEDS and SDF	Economic empowerment of conflict affected; micro-finance support
Sarvodaya Suwasetha	Take care of malnourished and abandoned children; teenage mothers; uplift nutrition status of children
Sarvodaya Legal Services Movement	Provide lost documents and National Identity Cards; advocate for human rights; legal mediation at village level
Sarvodaya Women's Movement	Livelihood development for conflict affected women; support mother- headed families; promote women participation in decision-making
Sarvodaya Shanthi Sena	Inter-religious dialogues; youth for peace; inter-district youth exchange camps; amity camps

SRTS and Sarvo-Tech	Reconstruction and rehabilitation of damaged infrastructure; vocational training for ex-combatants






